

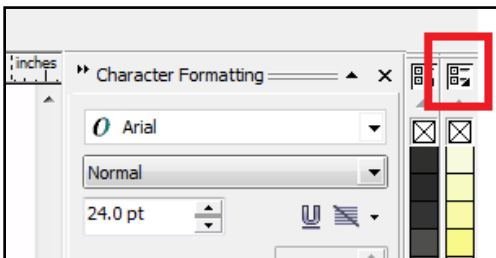

How to Add a Color to the MultiRIP_RGB_COREL Palette that is on the 2040 Color Chart in CorelDraw.

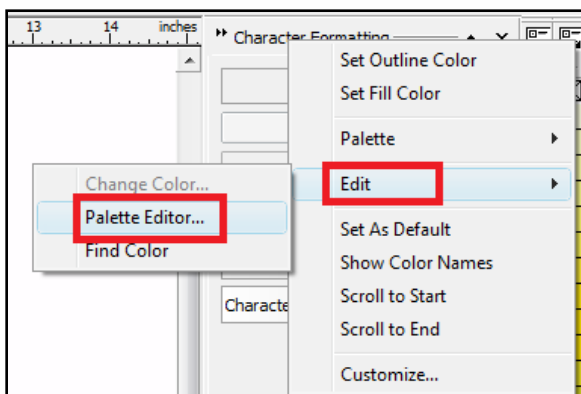
Problem: After printing and comparing the 510 Color Chart to the 2040 Color Chart, you find a color that you would prefer to use on the 2040 Color Chart that does not show up in the Color Palette? How can you add this color into your Color Palette?

Answer: You can easily add additional colors to your palette or create your own color palette in CorelDraw. Here are the instructions on how to do this:

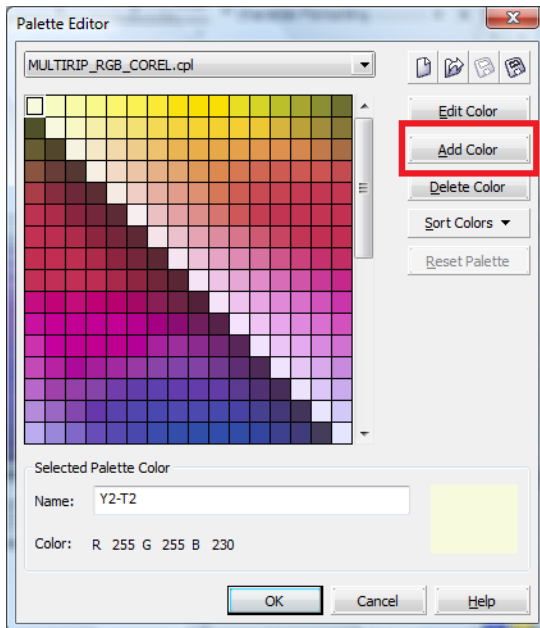
1. Print the 2040 color chart. Locate the color you want to print and determine what the X- and Y-axis coordinates are for that box. (i.e. R3-T21).
2. Open the MR_RGB_Color_Chart_Values.pdf file. Find the coordinates from the color chart in the PDF file. Then, see what the Red, Green and Blue values are. (i.e. R 242 G 145 B 0).
3. Go into Corel and open the Palette Editor for the MULTIRIP_RGB_COREL.cpl Palette by right clicking over the box icon in the top right corner illustrated below:



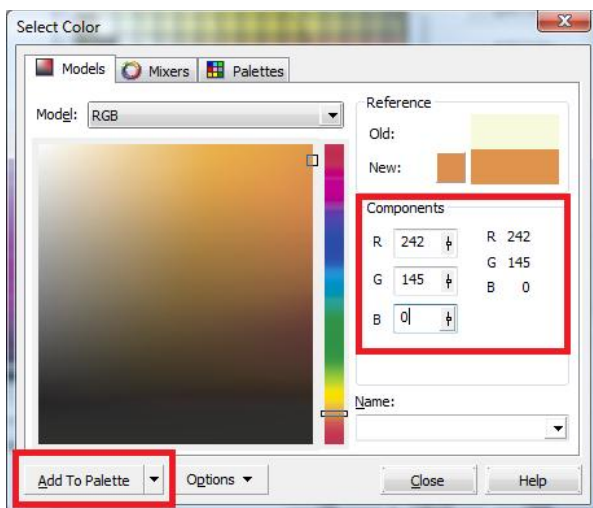
4. Select the Edit menu and choose Palette Editor.



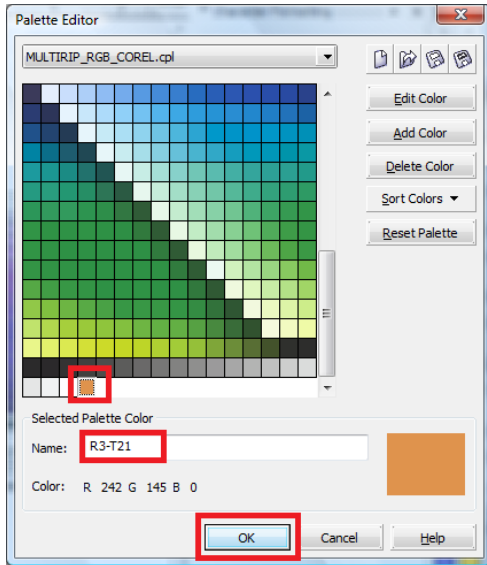
5. In the Palette Editor screen, click on the Add Color button.



6. In the Select Color screen, you will want to type in the Red, Green and Blue values into the appropriate fields. Then click the Add To Palette button and the Close button.



7. In the Palette Editor screen, you will see the new color listed at the bottom of the Color Palette. Click on the color and you can now change the name in the Name field below to match the Color Chart. Then click on the OK button.



8. The color should now show up at the bottom of your Color Palette.
