



**What are the Recommended Computer Requirements for MultiRIP?

Will it work on a 64-bit operating system?**

MultiRIP Film RIP printing software program is for PC computers. Some users have used our software programs on MAC computers while operating them in a PC operating environment. However, we can only provide specific technical support when running the software on a Microsoft operating system on a MAC. Thus we strongly encourage anyone considering running the software on this type of computer to download a trial version of the software and test it out. Here are the recommended requirements to run MultiRIP Film on a PC operating system.

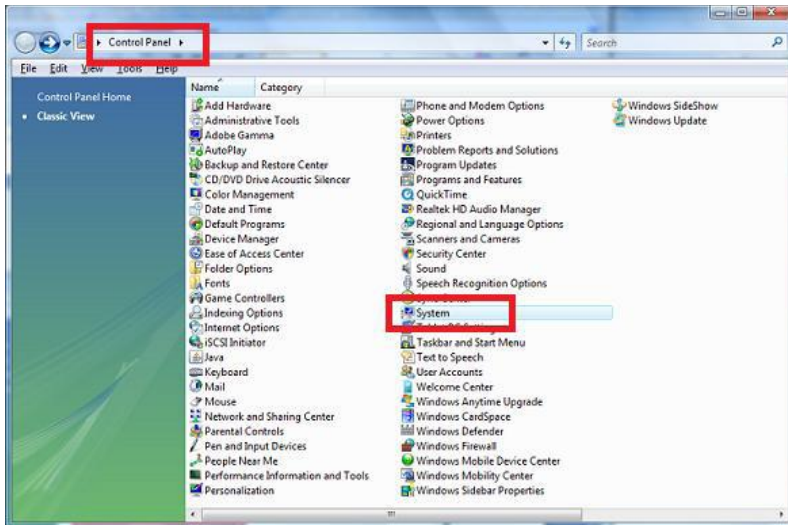
- ❖ 1 GB RAM minimum*
- ❖ 1 GB available disk space
- ❖ Server: Windows /2000/XP/2003/Vista/Vista x64
- ❖ Clients: Windows 95/98/Me/NT/2000/XP/2003/Vista/Vista x64

*Performance improved with additional RAM and disk capacity above the minimum

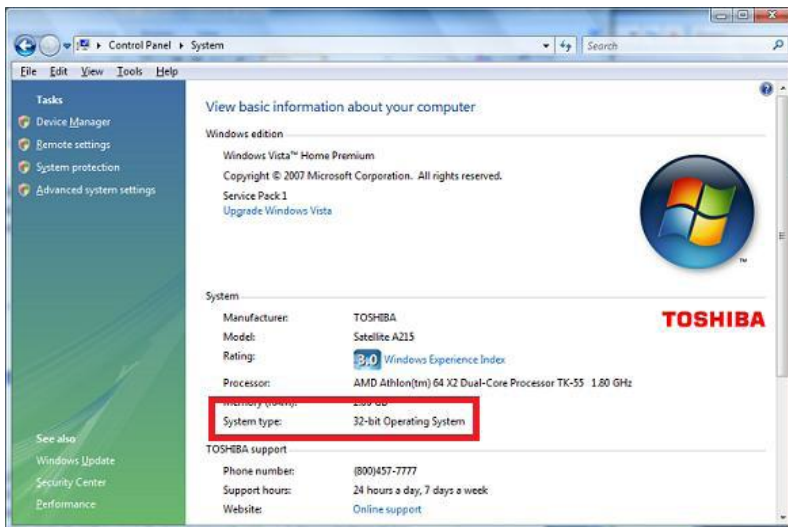
WARNING: 64-Bit Operating Systems

In order to use a computer that has 64-bit operating system to run MultiRIP, the operating system must be setup to allow 32-bit drivers to be installed. The default setting when you install the 64-bit operating system is not to allow 32-bit drivers. In the Decorated Apparel Industry, most software programs (including MultiRIP) require the use of 32-bit drivers. To check to see if your computer is running a 64-bit operating system, follow these steps:

1. Go into your Control Panel. Click on the System link.



2. Scroll down and it will state what operating system you are using.



Some 64-bit operating systems will allow the user to install 32-bit drivers. However, it should be noted that most of the time this setting must be done when the operating system is installed on the computer. Please consult your computer manufacturer if you want to know how format your 64-bit operating system to allow it to run 32-bit drivers.
